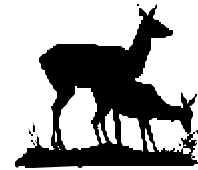

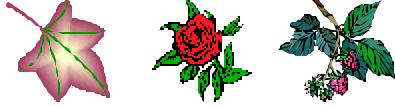

Cherries, Plums	(<i>Prunus</i> spp.)	sunny
Hybrid Tea Rose	(<i>Rosa x hybrid</i>)	sunny
Roses (most)	(<i>Rosea</i> spp.)	sunny
American Arborvitae	(<i>Thuja occidentalis</i>)	sunny
Rhododendrons	(<i>Rhododendron</i> spp.)	sunny, partial sun
Norway Maple	(<i>Acer platanoides</i>)	sunny, partial shade
Eastern Redbud	(<i>Cercis canadensis</i>)	sunny, partial shade
Wild red raspberry	(<i>Rubus idaeus</i>)	sunny, partial shade
Gray Dogwood	(<i>Cornus racemosa</i>)	sunny, shade
Winged Euonymus	(<i>Euonymus alatus</i>)	sunny, shade

Phlox, common	(<i>Phlox multiflora</i>)	sunny, partial sun
Tulips	(<i>Tulipa</i> sp.)	sunny, partial sun
Hosta	(<i>Hosta</i> spp.)	shade
