Whether you receive a paper or electronic utility bill, you can set up a recurring payment for your monthly bill from your bank account or a credit card. Visit www.burnsville.org/utilities for more information or to enroll.	No lawn or garden sprinkling or other irrigation can take place between 11 a.m. and 3 p.m. any day. Odd-even restrictions allow property addresses ending in an odd number (1,3,5,7,9) to water on odd-numbered calendar days, and addresses ending in an even number (2,4,6,8,0) to water on even-numbered calendar days. If there are 31 days in a month, both even and odd addresses can water on the 31 st .	If BANK DRAFT is printed in the balance due box, you have enrolled in an automatic payment plan. With this option, the monthly balance due will be withdrawn from the customer's checking account on the bill due date. BANK DRAFT appears in the balance due box once the automatic payment plan has been accepted.

A returned check fee will be imposed on any dishonored check per Minnesota Statute 604.113

When you provide a check as a payment, you authorize us to either use information from your check to make a one-time electronic fund transfer from your account or to process the payment as a check transaction. When we use information from your check to make an electronic transfer, funds may be withdrawn from your account as soon as the same day that we receive your payment, and you will not receive your check back from your financial institution.

DESCRIPTION OF SERVICES

Water – Charge based on the water consumption registered on your meter.

City Sewer – Collection and transportation of sewage to metro sewage lines. *Residential charge is based on water usage during winter months.*

Met Sewer – Transportation and treatment of sewage completed by the Metropolitan Council Environmental Services (MCES). *Residential charge is based on water usage during the winter months.*

Base Charge – A base charge is assessed to all properties for each of the core services of water, city sewer and met sewer. The fees collected offset expenses that are the same at all addresses no matter how much usage (meter reading, bill processing, forms, postage, etc.).

Storm Water/Surface Water Quality – Fees to operate, maintain and replace the storm water system, as well as preserve and improve the water quality in the City's lakes and ponds. The fees are determined based on the amount of water run-off a property generates. For example, since commercial/industrial properties have more impervious surfaces (pavement, rooftops, etc.) and larger parcels than residential properties, they pay a higher fee based on their total acreage.

Street Lighting – Fee for the operation, maintenance and replacement of the City streetlights.

Sidewalk Snowplowing – Fee is only charged to a property that is adjacent to a sidewalk.

Major Roadway Lighting – Fee for the operation, maintenance and replacement of major roadway and intersection lights.

Private Hydrant Maint – Fee for the inspection of fire hydrants located on private water service or fire lines to ensure they work properly for fire protection.

Meter Replacement Fee – Fee charged per meter designated for the replacement of water meters.

Tax – State sales tax charged to commercial customers based on water used.

State Surcharge – Fee charged by the Minnesota Department of Health for water quality testing.

Penalty – Charge for submitting a utility bill payment after the due date. The fee is based on a percent of the unpaid balance.

Water Restriction Fee – Charges for violating the City's water conservation ordinance.

Water Turn-On – Charge for having water service turned on at the street.

Water Shut-Off – Charge for having water service turned off at the street.

Damaged Meter – Charge for replacing a damaged or tampered meter.

Duplicate Bill Fee – Fee for a duplicate bill mailed to an additional address.
