

## Home Condition, Parking and Storage

When maintaining a home, garage and all exterior property, make sure that everything is structurally sound and in good condition.



### Home Condition

All walls must be free from holes or open cracks and maintained weatherproof.

Foundations must be free from cracks and holes.

No surface may be allowed to have peeling paint. Only wood that is treated or naturally resistant to decay may be left unpainted.

Windows and doors must be operable. Glazing must be free from cracks or holes and the assembly must be weather tight.

Decks, stairs and rails must be in good condition and able to safely perform intended functions.

### House Numbers

House numbers must be posted near the front entrance and easily readable from the street. The numerals must be a color that contrasts with the background and at least 4 inches high. Choose an alternate location on the house if a clear view of the entrance is not possible.

## Storage

Exterior storage of any type is prohibited, with a few exceptions:

- Recreational vehicles, such as boats, snowmobiles or ATV's when kept on a trailer (see RV & Trailer Parking information).
- Patio or lawn furniture and cooking appliances, provided the items were designed specifically for exterior use.
- Firewood that is split, neatly stacked and meets setback and screening requirements.



## Parking and Vehicles

Parking is not allowed on any City street between 2 and 6 a.m. Vehicles may not be parked in any manner that interferes with snow removal. On-street parking exemptions can be requested for limited occasions at [www.burnsville.org/request](http://www.burnsville.org/request).

Parked vehicles must be currently licensed and operable.

Vehicles that are not licensed or are inoperable must be stored in the garage.

All vehicles must be parked on a surface consisting of concrete, asphalt or pavers.

One commercially-licensed vehicle of 22 feet or less in length may be parked on a residential property if used by a resident for transportation to their job on a daily basis.

Recreational vehicles, boats and trailers may be parked on a driveway up to 14 continuous days or stored in the side or back yard (see RV & Trailer Parking information).
