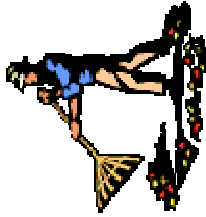


## Composting of Yard Wastes



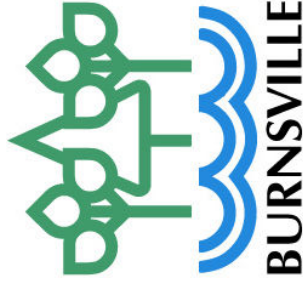
(7-10-1) Composting of yard waste from your property is an acceptable option to having it hauled away. Here are some things you should know. The container for compost must be made of durable materials and can not exceed 30 square feet for most lots, setbacks apply. The compost can not harbor rodents, create a fire hazard or a nuisance odor. It must also be turned and mixed to promote the decomposition of the materials. You may not compost meat, dairy products, pet wastes or similar items.

## General Rules for Rubbish and Garbage Disposal

(4-8-3-5) Storage and disposal of rubbish and garbage is an important part of urban life. The rules are as follows;

- ⇒ All exterior property and the interior of every home must be kept free from any excessive accumulations of rubbish and garbage.
- ⇒ All occupants of a home or structure must place all rubbish and garbage into containers with tight fitting lids. The type of containers provided by your refuse hauler are acceptable for storage of your garbage pending pickup.
- ⇒ All rubbish and garbage must be removed from the site on a scheduled basis and be properly disposed of. Garbage being kept which results in nuisance odors is prohibited.
- ⇒ All exterior trash and recycling containers must be screened from view or stored inside your garage. You can successfully screen trash and recycling containers with evergreens incorporated into landscaping, privacy type fencing or commercially produced screening enclosures.
- ⇒ Appliances may be placed outside a maximum of 72 hours prior to a scheduled curbside pickup. All items should be secured to prevent them from tipping & holding water; the doors on appliances like refrigerators or freezers should be secured shut or removed to prevent entrapment of young children.

It is against the law to attempt to dispose of personal electronic items in your regular trash or recycling collection. This type of equipment can not be

disposed of in landfills and must be recycled. Dakota County supports the Gopher Resource Corporation and accepts household electronics such as TV's, Computers, VCR's and Micro-waves. 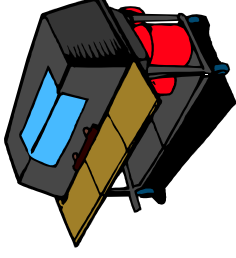

## Exterior Storage is Prohibited



(10-7-21) Exterior storage of any kind or type is prohibited, with few exceptions. Recreational vehicles, such as boats, snowmobiles or ATV's when kept on a trailer that is le-

gally stored in compliance with 6-10-4 is one exception. Others include patio or lawn furniture and cooking appliances, provided all of these were items designed specifically for exterior use. Fire wood that is cut and split, neatly stacked and behind the front setback of the home is one final exception.
